The mission of the Oak Savanna Alliance (OSA) is to promote the protection, restoration, and awareness of oak savannas on public and private lands in the greater Southern Kettle Moraine area.

OSA is a partnership of government, local conservation groups, and private landowners interested in preserving Oak Savannas and increasing awareness of this rare natural community.

Oak openings now share equal billing with tallgrass prairies as the most threatened in the world. Intact examples of oak savanna vegetation are now so rare that less than 500 acres exist in Wisconsin. This is less than 0.01% of the
